Participate in a Survey with the School of Psychology, UCD (COVID-19)

What's Involved

Complete a survey on the impact of positive psychology on wellbeing (COVID-19)

UCD School of Psychology continues to carry out many surveys and research programmes to understand how COVID-19 might impact on the wellbeing of our society and help to inform mental health services on how to best support people.

They are currently looking for volunteers to "Complete a survey on the impact of positive psychology on wellbeing (COVID-19)". This is an online anonymous survey. It can be completed from anywhere, including the comfort of your own home.

If you are over 18 years of age you now can take this anonymous survey developed by the UCD School of Psychology for adults living in Ireland. The research focuses on understanding the aspects of positive psychology (such as gratitude) that may influence wellbeing, particularly depression, anxiety and stress of people living in the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland in relation to COVID-19.

This study is funded by the Health Services Executive (HSE). By completing this survey, you will help to understand the effect COVID-19 has on wellbeing, and how services can

best support people impacted. You are invited to take part in this research wherever you are living in Ireland.

Participate in Research with the Institute of Food and Health UCD

What's Involved

Women needed to complete food, exercise and mind survey (COVID-19)

Researchers in the Institute of Food and Health, UCD, are conducting research on the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the food intake, physical activity and mental health of women and their infants. Some women are already experiencing negative impact but there is no clear picture of who is affected and by how much.

You will be asked to complete a 15-mins survey on food intake, physical activity, body weight and mental wellbeing. If you have just had a baby, you will be asked about infant feeding. You must be over 18 to take part.

Oral History Abstract Role Cuimhneamh an Chlair

What's Involved

Cuimhneamh An Chláir which translates to (Memories of Clare) is a voluntary and independent charity (CHY20976) who digitally record, archive, and showcase the memories, folklore and traditions of Clare's oldest citizens. Cuimhneamh An Chlair have documented the life stories, memories and folklore of hundreds of Clare's oldest citizens with people aged from 65-106 years. They are motivated by a sense of urgency, mindful that the current elderly population may represent the last link to an older way of life in Clare. They provide a platform for the dissemination of the material

collected through co-operation with community groups, schools, third level institutions, and the broader public.

Due to the current pandemic, they are unable to carry out our regular face to face interviews. But are working on their current archive of interviews in producing abstracts for each interview. They are looking for volunteers who may have an interest in History & Folklore.

The tasks for this Abstract role would be as follows: -

Ability to listen, abstract and type from audio to MS Word - NOTE: we do not transcribe interviews but ensure the topics and general info from the interview is documented according to set timeslots

Attention to detail

Ability to check facts and ensure spelling of certain words like townlands is accurate i.e. pause interview and do web search

Be comfortable with email, internet and online communications Learn use of software such as Audacity

The volunteer must

Have an interest in oral history and folklore Good keyboard skills, knowledge of MS Word Good communication skills. Good level of English both oral & written. Have an interest in working with older persons and their life stories

The volunteer will be fully inducted, and any training required will be done on Zoom.

English Conversation Tutors - Failte Isteach

Fáilte Isteach is an organisation that provides opportunities for people to contribute to their communities and engage actively in society. Fáilte Isteach involves volunteers welcoming migrants to the community through conversational English classes. It provides more than the transfer of skills and knowledge. It is making a positive difference to everyone involved.

They have recently started their teaching online and are looking for additional volunteers to join their team.
